

## Deaths


**Kent Hendrickson**, dean of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) Libraries (1985-95) before being promoted to associate vice chancellor for information services (IS), has died. His tenure in the libraries saw the birth of the Friends of the Libraries, the adoption of new technologies (such as the online catalog and the addition of the 2-millionth volume, *Shakespeare's Comedies, Histories and Tragedies, 1623*). During his tenure in IS, many advances in computing technology services were accomplished, including a 950 percent increase in the use of computing. From 1964 to 1970, he was associate director for technical services for the UNL Libraries. From 1970 to 1982, Hendrickson worked in the publishing industry in Oregon for Richard Abel and Company, which was later acquired by Blackwell's North America. He joined the University of Arizona in 1982 in library services and later returned to UNL from Arizona. *W*
